

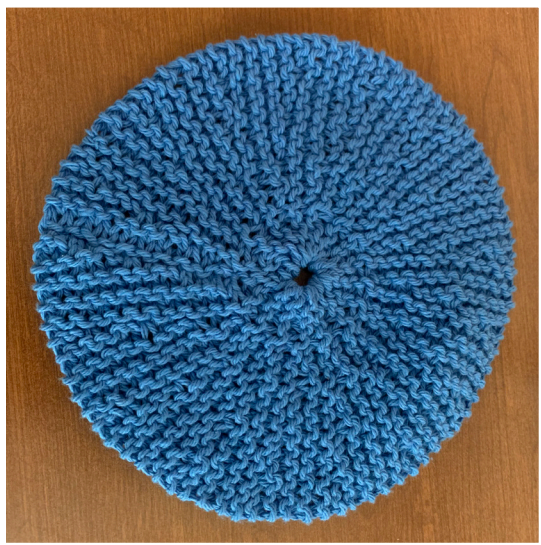


Cheryl Beckerich Knits

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Round Short Row Dishcloth

with [German Short Rows](#)



Skill Level

Intermediate

Finished Size

Diameter: 8.5 in/23 cm

Gauge

16 sts = 4-in/10-cm in
garter stitch

Materials

1 Ball Lily Sugar "n Cream, 100%
cotton, 4 oz/113 g, 200 yds/
184 m

or 50 yds/45 m cotton dishcloth
yarn

Size 8 US/5 mm needles
Stitch markers
Tapestry needle

Pattern

CO 15 sts.

Row 1: K3, turn, sl1 from left needle to right needle. Pull working yarn up and over the needle to form a double st, k2. *This is a [German Short Row](#), and it will be used throughout the pattern. Feel free to substitute your favorite short row technique.*

Row 2: K2, knit the double st being sure to insert the right needle under both front legs of the st, k3, sl1 from left needle to right needle. Pull working yarn up and over the needle to form a double st, k5.

From this point on, whenever there is a double st, work that double st by inserting the right needle under both front legs of the double st and complete the knit stitch.

Row 3: K9, sl1 from left needle to right needle. Pull working yarn up and over the needle to form a double st, k8.

Row 4: K12, sl1 from left needle to right needle. Pull working yarn up and over the needle to form a double st, k11.

Rows 5 & 6: Knit to end of row.

This completes the first wedge of the round dishcloth. Repeat this wedge 17 times for a total of 18 wedges, but on the 18th wedge, do not work **Row 6 of the wedge**. BO. Run yarn through the sts at the center of the circle and pull until snug to cinch the center of the circle closed. Sew the BO edge to the CO edge. With tapestry needle, work in loose ends.



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
